Ethereal Silence - a solo show of artist Neeraja Divate

Silence is one of the great arts of Conversation. - Marcus Tullius Cicero

Ethereal Silence is an exhibition of selected works of the artist Neeraja Divate which she has been contemplating with a true commitment and artistic fervour to share the outcome with the society at large. She has an absolute passion for the arts so even after the hiatus of a few years she continued to embark on this journey and produced a sizable number of works with complete precision.

Art in a simpler form is a culmination of expressive ideas, beliefs, emotions and skill to portray on any surface which subsequently gets its classification as per the type, medium, genre and so on. Some of the creativity which necessarily do not fall in the categorization actually originate from the innermost feelings of an artistic soul that resonate with the nature, psychology of an introspective mind and most importantly the philosophy of life.

Neeraja Divate's longing to perceive, interpret and communicate those intrinsic senses and nuances of life in the vicinity, qualify her to be considered in the later category of the above classification. In most of the representations around us, where the viewers are amazed and perplexed by the vibrancy of colours, bounty of extremely coded concepts or astonishing realistic representation, Neeraja has chosen a different path to traverse and a meticulous effort to carve a niche by the subtle representation of her ingenuity.

The artworks in the exhibition are dedicated to different aspects of non-representational arts carrying abundant feelings and precise depiction resulting from the minute observation from the neighbourhood. The artist admits that her minimalistic inspiration is from her life and immediate surroundings, the mundane objects, incidents, dialogues and even in behaviours around her. She truly believes that the methods she practices, materials she uses and meanings she is keen to engender, challenge her inherent creative thoughts and imagination and subsequently come out in a very powerful expressive language which viewers would suitably appreciate.

The current series of works she has been working around the theme of raindrop is somewhere inspired by the nostalgic feeling of her childhood she has spent in the small town in Andhra Pradesh which was devoid of adequate rain and those sparse water drops falling on to the parched soil stimulates a prodigious impression on the senses of the spectators. Neeraja effectively attempts to narrate those incidents and experiences into her artworks.

Neeraja's drawings personify enigmatic completeness and a deep silence- almost losing their physicality in-depth and becoming space in itself. The fullness of emotion, eternal-feeling the peak of the unspeakable- the embodiment of darkest dark in the greys- absolute dearth to experience a drop, all similar feelings get emulated. Subsequently, some of the drawings resonate with therapeutic fullness of time, moment, emotion and space.

With her muted colour and barely visible lines, Neeraja, creates a paradoxical sense of space. Her works set out to expose the essence or identity of a subject through eliminating all non-essential forms, features or concepts. She uses graphite and pen & Damp; ink on paper. She treats paper like a cloth to give it a three-dimensional surface along with a gestural aspect of impressing the surface. There is a personal language in her oeuvre that relates not only to the work but also to the sense of simplicity.


The monochrome colour and minimalistic composition of Neeraja's works give a feeling of calmness and serenity to the viewers. Her abstract expressions are fluid, subtle, and enigmatic that explore beauty and subtle nuances of water. Using the Somerset paper and impressing the paper to form images by using a blunt knife often yield a spectacular result. In some of her works she does not even paint, draw or write but rather create images through the accumulation of thousands of strokes with her knife.

Neeraja Divate's works traverse the lines between Metaphor, Reality and Illusion and range from plays on nature and science theories manifested in diverse creative medium. Her works explore aesthetics of flow of water, encounter to ask questions about permanence and transience, object and image, fact and illusion. The artist does an extensive practice that varies from appropriating subtle microcosmic activity, make meticulous drawings on paper that hinge on the unique quality of hand – drawn strokes.

Neeraja strikes the balance of painting that allows the power of thought as well as the power of feeling. The capacity to reflect on our own nature, to abstract but also to feel: the rational and sensuous experience. They attain the viewers' inner psyche by minimizing conscious distractions while evoking unconscious feelings with unlimited possibilities to explore and communicate with many dimensions of human emotions.




UNTITLED - 1 30 X 48 INCHES GRAPHITE ON SOMERSET PAPER










THE CALM – 2 30 X 33.5 INCHES MIXED MEDIA ON SOMERSET PAPER










UNTITLED - 2 36 X 48 INCHES MIXED MEDIA ON MOUNT BOARD






REFLECTIONS - 3 7.5 X 7.5 INCHES MIXED MEDIA ON SOMERSET PAPER







